Zig Ziglar in a laibu **You Can Reach The Top** a cih sungah mihing lungsim puakzia (attitude) nam nga om hi ci-in na gelh hi. Tua nam ngate khat khat na en ni. Khatna, amah leh amah a ki-etzia (self-esteem) ci hi. Hih pen nang leh nang na ki-etzia leh ki-sa'nzia, manpha na kisakna leh mantawm na kisakna thu hi. Nihna, itna leh itzia tawh kisai thu hi (attitude of love). Midangte i muhia leh itzia tawh kisai hi a, hih in zong i lungsim puakzia hong kimusak hi. Thumna, upna tawh kisai lungpuakzia (attitude of faith). Pasian na upna in midang na etzia hong kilamdangsak hi. Lina, lametna tawh kisai lungpuakzia (attitude of hope). Hih in mailam i etzia tawh kisai hi. Lametna tawh nungta mite' lungsim puakzia leh lametna nei lote kikal kigamla mahmah hi. Ngana, midangte maisakna tawh kisai lungpuakzia (attitude of forgiveness). Hih i gen ciangin a beisa hunte tawh kisai hi. Midangte'n nang tungah bang hiam hong cih manin tuni in vangik na puak hiam? Na maisak a tam leh na mailam a veng ding hi. Na maisak a tawm leh nang leh nang vangik a kiguan nahi hi. Mite mawhna maisak lecin na vanpuak hong kiam ding hi.

I Lai Siangtho simna mun i et ciangin sawltak Paul in mihing nam thum na gen hi. Hih nam thum sungah mihing i hih leh kihelloh a pelmawh hi.

I. LEITUNG MI (I Korin 2:14) : 'Leitung mi' i cih ciangin i pianpih mihinna, Pasian thu tawh a nungta lo, leitung mihing ngeina bangin nungta cihna hi. Hih bang mite sungah mihing ngeina bangin mi hoih mahmah zong om a, mi sia mahmah zong om hi. Amau hoihna leh siatna tawh kisai loin amau sungah Pasian Kha Siangtho a ten ngei loh manin leitung mi kici hi. Hih bang leitung mi i cihte Lai Siangtho in hih bangin na gen hi.

Amah siatna lam manawh mi hi: Leitung mi in mawhna lamnaih leh tua lampi tot ding mansa in om tawntung hi. Tua hi a, mawhna bawl pen ama adingin a haksa hi loin a pianpih lungsim puakzia tua mah hipah hi (Late 58:3, Isaiah 48:8, John 8:44, Efesa 2:3).

Amah siatna lamah kikai, ki-uk hi (Efesa 2:1-13): Mawhna in sila bangin a talkaih, amau deihetna zong nei thei nawn lo mi tampi om uh hi. Mawhna nangawn bawl zo nawn lo zah dawngin cimtaak napi'n ahih hangin nusia thei loin mawhna in kai koikoi hi. Hi bang mite mawhna sungah saltang bangin om uh a, Pasian sangin a teelzawh uh mawhna in gacip hi.

Amah khuamial sungah om hi (II Kor. 4:4, 1:18): Dawimangpa in mit mialna pia in sihna khukpi lam zuan veve mi tampi om hi. Mawhna a kihhuaizia zong mu loin mawhna hangin a tate tungah gimna tung nangawn mu thei lo papi tampi om hi. Innsung mial tampite hangin gamsung siatna piangsak khangnote khalam khuamuhna nei loin hong khangkhia uh hi. Nu leh pa khalam a mitmialna hangin a tate uh khuavak lampi hih thei lo bek hi loin hih leitung nuntakna ah zong lampi lak thei lo uh hi. Tua mialna pen mialna lian mahmah ahi hi.

Amah hell sunga dingin mawhpaihsa hi (Late 9:17): Sihna khukpi hell sunga dingin mawhpaihsa mite ahi uh hi. A siangtho Pasian kiangah mawhna tawh kitung thei lo ding a, mawh maisak mite bek tung ding hi. Hell khuk sung tun nadingin mawhna tampi bawl ding kisam lo a, mawh maisak nadingin hong kipia Pasian Tapa Jesu sang loin ama siansakna nialna hi. Hell khuk sung na tun leh Pasian mawhna hi loin nangma mawhna hang hi ding hi. A dam nading Pasian in hong vaihawmsaksa om napi na thupi simloh man hi ding hi.

Amah kha thu-ah a sisa hi (Efesa 2:1): Mi tampi leitung nuntakna ah lawhcing mahmah napi'n khalam lamah a si uh hi. Naga ulian khat tawh ka kihona ka phawk hi. "Leitung sum leh pai tampi ka neih hangin bang hangin lungkim thei lo ka hi hiam?" hong ci hi. "Lungsim bawlpaw' om lohna pumpi ah lungkimna om thei lo hi" cih ama kiangah ka genpih hi. Khalam thu-ah a sisa, Pasian tawh kizopna nei lo mite pumpi ah a nuntak lai hangin a sisa na hi gige uh hi. (sutzop ding)

UPDATES FROM WWAA - May 2026

Dear Coworkers in Christ,

Greetings in the precious name of our Lord Jesus Christ, who died and rose again for us.

May 1, 2026. I was invited by the district headquarter Women's Fellowship to preach and encourage women through God's Word. I spoke from Proverbs 31:30 which reminds us that true beauty is not found in outward appearance but in a heart that reveres and follows God. As we gathered with women and widows for fellowship and encouragement, we were reminded that a life rooted in the fear of the Lord is precious in His sight and worthy of praise.

Approximately 200 women and widows attended the fellowship. The women's society graciously presented a beautiful shawl to each widow in attendance, and I was also honored to receive one. The gathering was filled with joy, fellowship, and spiritual encouragement.

The same day, at noon, there was graduation ceremony of Evangelical College of Theology (ECT) at ECT Chapel, Nehru Marg. Each year, our family presents the Late Rev.K.Singson Memorial Award (inmemory of my late husband) to the student who achieves the highest marks in the Bachelor of Theology program.

I was thankful to be present personally to present the award this year and give glory to God for this opportunity.

May 3, 2026. The First Sunday of every month, we spent time by prying together and held Widows meeting.

May 9, 2026. I attended the graduation ceremony of Discipleship Theological Seminary (DTS) at Molnom Church. Each year, our family presents the Late Rev.K.Singson Memorial Award (inmemoryof my late husband) to the student who achieves the highest marks in the Bachelor of Theology program.

May 9-10, 2026-Mother's Day Services

I was invited to minister at Thongkholui Village Church during their Mother's Day celebration. Although it is a small church, attendance exceeded the building's capacity, and some members had to sit outside. The congregation received God's Word with great enthusiasm.

A particularly meaningful moment was when the fathers of the church sang a special song that I composed nearly forty years ago. The song encourages fathers to watch over and lead their families faithfully, drawing lessons from the days of Noah.

May11, 2026. This was a very sad day for our organization. The Chairperson of WWAA lost her eldest son at the age of 40 after a prolonged illness. He leaves behind his wife and minor son.

Our team attended the funeral service to stand with the family, offer comfort, and share in their grief during this difficult time.

May13, 2026. We awoke to heart breaking news that several pastors had been ambushed while returning from a pastors' conference in Churachandpur District to Kangpokpi District, Manipur.

Seven pastors and drivers were traveling in three vehicles when attackers opened fire on the first two vehicles. Three pastors were killed instantly, and several others were injured.

This tragic incident shocked Christians across India and around the world. Sadly, violence in Manipur continues to affect countless families. Villages are still being attacked and burned, forcing many innocent people to flee their homes and become refugees in their own land.

It is heartbreaking to witness children, elderly men, and women leaving behind everything they own in search of safety. We continue to pray for peace, justice, and healing in Manipur.

May16, 2026. Our granddaughter, the eldest daughter of our second son Noble, underwent brain surgery to remove a bloodclot. By God's grace, the operation was successful. Although her recovery has been slow, she continues to improve. We kindly ask for your prayers for her complete healing and restoration.

May19, 2026. I spent time at Jacob Prayer Mountain in fellowship with the Lord through prayer, worship, and meditation on His Word. The presence of the Holy Spirit was a great encouragement and blessing.

May 20, 2026. We continue our ministry support to orphanages and the Naomi Foundation Mission in Myanmar (Burma). Our contributions and partnership with the Burma mission remain ongoing.

May 30, 2026. I was invited to speak on the subject of parenting at an AG Church gathering attended by many members of the congregation. During the session, I emphasized the importance of biblical parenting and the vital role parents play in shaping the lives of their children.

Many parents today lack the knowledge and practical skills needed to guide their children effectively. I spoke about the importance of spending quality time with children, especially during their formative years, when they need loving care, godly instruction, and wise guidance. Sadly, many children fall into harmful habits and influences because their parents are too busy to notice their struggles or provide the direction they need.

The congregation responded positively to the message, and we trust that the Lord will help parents raise their children in His ways, nurturing them to become responsible and God-fearing individuals.

May 31, 2026. I had the privilege of participating in the inauguration function of the Zou Holy Bible at the Lutheran Church in Zou veng.

4. Pray for God's guidance and blessing upon my upcoming ministry engagements.
5. Pray for provision of a reliable vehicle to support our ministry work and outreach activities.

May the Lord richly bless you as we continue serving Him together and bringing hope to those in need.
